

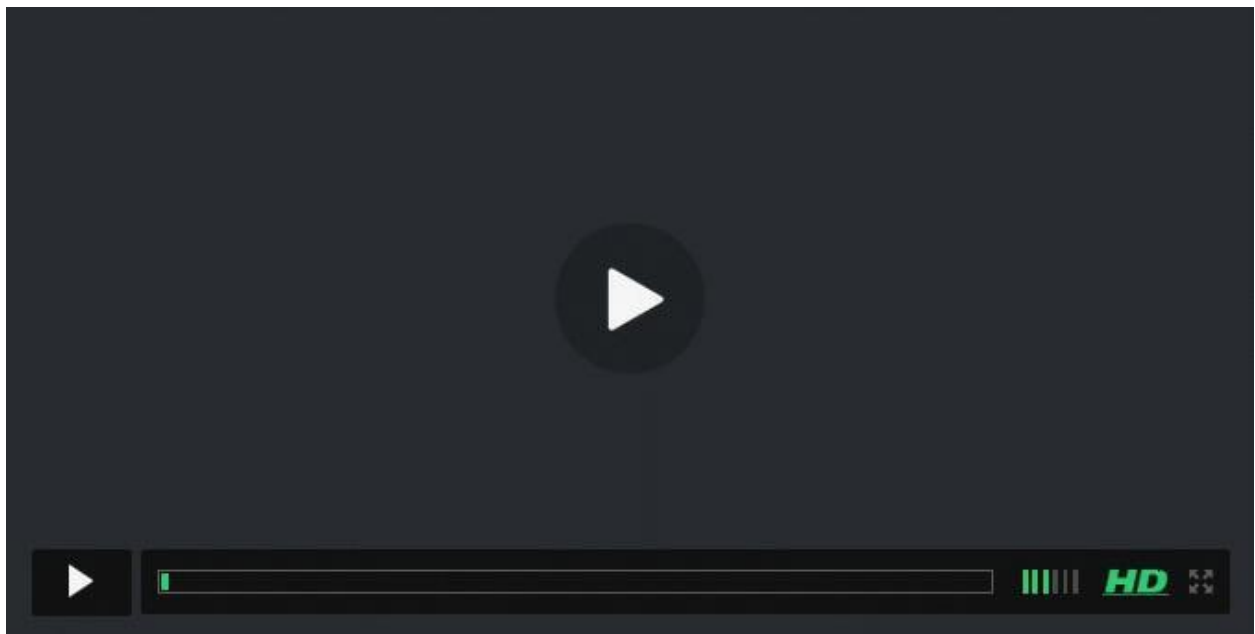

What time does 2026 Montana's Brier Draws kick off?

The Curling events between 2026 Montana's Brier will be played at Mary Brown's Centre in St. John's.

The match will start at 7:00 p.m. IST (7:00 p.m. local time and 1:30 p.m. GMT) on Thursday, March 5.

Two of the most successful teams in ICC Men's T20 World Cup history, India and England, are set for a face off in the second semi-final on Thursday.

The defending champions and co-hosts had their flaws exposed in the 76-run defeat against South Africa in their Super 8 Group 1 opening game, but the Men in Blue responded with commanding wins against Zimbabwe and the West Indies to reach the semi-finals.

Also, off just one defeat in the campaign so far, when they were defeated by 30 runs by the Windies, England have been undefeated for five matches - including all their games in the Super 8 stage.

A repeat of the previous edition's semi-final, it will be a battle for a record third title as India and England once again vie for a spot in the final slated for March 8.

While reports suggest a debate over whether Abhishek Sharma should be dropped due to poor form in the tournament, with options like Rinku Singh available, the management might prefer to continue with the same combination for the knockouts.

Considering the small boundaries and turning pitch at Wankhede, India might look to play an extra spinner and a strong lower-order hitting lineup.

India predicted XI: Sanju Samson (wk), Abhishek Sharma, Ishan Kishan, Suryakumar Yadav (c), Tilak Varma, Hardik Pandya, Shivam Dube, Axar Patel, Arshdeep Singh, Varun Chakaravathy, Jasprit Bumrah.

Captain Harry Brook is in fine form, including a century earlier in the tournament, while all-rounders like Will Jacks and Sam Curran have been vital contributors with both bat and ball for England.

Despite an inconsistent performance by the opening pair of Phil Salt and Jos Buttler, England's strength lies in its depth, and the Wankhede conditions may demand the inclusion of spinners Rehan Ahmed and Adil Rashid.

England and India meet in the semi-final of a T20 World Cup for the third time in a row. On the previous two occasions, the winner has gone on to lift the trophy. Neither side has looked like the complete package so far, although England have exceeded pre-tournament expectations.

One Harry Brook century aside, they've been all over the place with the bat. The opening stand of Phil Salt and Jos Buttler have averaged just 12, and their route through the World Cup has been punctuated by tight victories. All-rounder Will Jacks, however, has arguably been the player of the tournament.

India entered as enormous favorites but had to dig themselves out of a hole against USA before getting thrashed by South Africa. However, they've found their rhythm since with thumping victories over Zimbabwe and the West Indies.

Varun Chakravarthy is their leading wicket-taker but he's taken punishment in some of the big games. Kuldeep Yadav, meanwhile, has an outstanding track record against England but has barely got a look-in at the tournament so far.

Eight of Jofra Archer's 10 wickets have come in the powerplay, which is where India crumbled against both USA and South Africa, but the Men in Blue have hit a tournament-leading 57 boundaries in the last four overs.

T20 World Cup co-host India is hoping for a return trip to the final, where they can attempt to defend their title after winning it all in 2024. However, they'll need to get through England first. It's a familiar match-up, as the two cricket forces squared off in the semifinals in 2024.

India ultimately defeated England by 68 runs, so it's safe to say that the Brits are hoping to turn the tables this time around. Both teams have had solid runs at this year's tournament, only losing one match each over the past month of competition.

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
