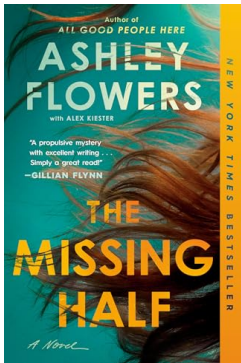


The Missing Half

This creates a sense of credibility within the story, encouraging readers to remain invested until the conclusion.
